Dear Uncle

Your letter came in due time, I would have answered at once, had not sickness & death interven, My Uncle of Palmer Reed Dental doctor died very suddenly Completely upsetting mama; who is never very well, and her attachments are very strong, We did not let her know grandpa was dead for sometime, I handed her your letter, she was very much pleased, I hope that Walter remembered his Aunt T Cato, she presents her warm regards to yourself Aunt Ann & family. "Well as I could not get work with your uncle; I wrote to Aunt Ford husband he kindly told me to come, that there was plenty of work for all willing to do, so I go to Ohio in March I guess; I will say nothing of myself time must prove me, thanking you for your kind interest & sincerely hoping you will not let me drop out of your member."
