## D-022 2:3: Transcription of George Pierce Sr. Diary and Accounts, 1885

This transcription from the original diary contains language contemporaneous of the time and is being presented as part of a historical record. Please note that this transcription has not been reviewed for final editing. Please contact us with any questions.

[Note: The early entries for 1885 are at the bottoms of the first pages of the diary volume for 1884. Pierce put in entries there for 1 January 1885 through 15 February 1885.

Entries for 16 February through 5 April 1885 are missing altogether.

There are no accounts for the ranch at the end of this volume of the diaries.

Tucked in this volume there is a yellow scrap of paper (part of an envelope) probably written by E Giddings Recorder. "Filed for Record in the recorders office of Yolo country California. Nov. 11th at 2 1/2 o'clock in book "E" Deeds on pag 106 107 E Giddings Recorder Sibley Deputy" There other scribblings on this side of the scrap. On the other side is the following, probably a scratch paper draft for an official document: "A portion of the sections 13 12 13 H G extending from the centre of Putah creek 32 rods north and I[number not clear] west back to center of Putah" Scribblings of signature E Giddings Recorder.]

Lost the best Cow I had to day a light Sprincle this forenoon quite a Shower this afternoon

Cut wood on the Iland

1885 George and teem went out to plow but it was too wet

Sun 4 Jan 1885

Sunday 1885 Heavy frost for Several days Stayed at home all day

Mon 5 Jan 1885

1885 Set out young vines in the old vinyard

Tues 6 Jan 1885

1885 Set out Grape vines this forenoon

Started one plow this afternoon the ground is verry wet

Wed 7 Jan 1885

1885 Planted Some Potatoes Turnips and pees. Started on other plow to day ground is verry wet

Loocks verry much like rain

[Entry appended here]: 1885 Sun Shone all day quite Strong. Run three plows

Thurs 8 Jan 1885

1885 Clowdy and darke all day loocked like rain all day. Commenced raining about five Oclock this afternoon

Fri 9 Jan 1885

Clowdy and dark all day

Run three plows

Sat 10 Jan 1885

1885 Commenced raining early last night and most of the night quite harde and nearly all day

Fixed for letting the Sows and young pigs into the Orchard

George and two of the men went to Davisville this afternoon. The Greene Pig [?]

Sun 11 Jan 1885 1885 Sun Shone all day

Mon 12 Jan 1885 1885 Sun Shone all day

Worked on pig pen

Tues 13 Jan 1885

1885 Commenced raining early last night and rained most of the night

verry clowdy and dark all day and loocked like rain most of the day

Got hogs out of Mr Russels field and off the creek

Wed 14 Jan 1885

1885 Sun Shone all day north wind moderate and quite cool

The mud has dryed up considerable. George went to Davisville and got the mail

Made gate for the pig pen

Thurs 15 Jan 1885

1885 Clear and fine all day north wind moderate. it has dryed up the mud Some

Cut wood at the house.

Hung gate at the pig pen.

The Chickens are pe[e]ping in the Incubater the time is up tomorrow for them to hatch

Fri 16 Jan 1885

1885 Set out locus trees in the hog lot

Plowed the garding this for[e]noon A little Sprincle of rain this afternoon just at night

Sat 17 Jan 1885

1885 Went to Davisville this afternoon did Some work on the lot in the Cemetry. Attended lodge at Davisville

Sun 18 Jan 1885 1885 Clear and fine

Mon 19 Jan 1885

1885 Heavy fog untill noon. clear the rest of the day. Started the plows this morning the land is verry wet

Tues 20 Jan 1885

1885 Heavy fog untill noon. run two plows on the Knowl and one in the east field north of the ditch

Mrs Pierce and George atten[d]ed Supprise party at Mr Andersons in Davisville and had a good time

Hung up the ham and Shoulders

I have been quite Sick all day

Wed 21 Jan 1885

1885 Hatched between 50 and 60 Chickens out of the first batch

I am feeling Some better to day

Thurs 22 Jan 1885

1885 George repaired the roof of the old chickenhouse.

Mr & Mrs Robson called to day and got Some Grape cuttings

Fri 23 Jan 1885

1885 George moved the Incubater into the old chicken house.

Went to Davisville this afternoon and got load of fencing to repair fence on the Creek. Heavy fog most of the day

Sat 24 Jan 1885

1885 George went to Woodland to get his teeth fixed.

Plowed on the Knowl. Clear all day

Repaired fence around the vinyard

Hevy fog just at night

Sun 25 Jan 1885 1885 Clear most of the day

Mon 26 Jan 1885 [No entry]

Tues 27 Jan 1885 [No entry]

Wed 28 Jan 1885

1885 Sowed wheat in the east field north of the ditch

Clowdy this afternoon

Big circles around the moon this evenind (sic)

Made gate for correll

Thurs 29 Jan 1885 1885 [Something crossed out]

George went to Sacramento and got a pig paid \$25--

Sold about \$18-- worth of almons

Fri 30 Jan 1885

1885 George and men repaired fence between the two big fields this afternoon.

Burnt brush in the vinyard

Sat 31 Jan 1885 1885 Attended Lodge at Davisville

Marstin got 7 head of Sheep at \$2.50

Repaired fence around the gardin and door yard

George and men repaired fence on the creek

Sun 1 Feb 1885 1885 Attended church at Davisville

Attended Lodg[e] at Davisville last evening. Mrs Pierce come after me to day

Mon 2 Feb 1885 1885 Finished plowing the Knowl this morning in the rain

A little rain last night

Tues 3 Feb 1885 1885 Set Walnut trees in the Hog lot near the windmill this afternoon

George went to Woodland and got 1/4 of Beef and got his teeth fixed

Wed 4 Feb 1885 1885 Finished pruning vines

Plowed land for Potatoes this forenoon

Started the harrows on the Knowl

George worked on the yearde for the little chickens

Thurs 5 Feb 1885 1885 Sowed Barly on the Knowl

Fogy and cold most of the day

Planted Potatoes

Fri 6 Feb 1885

1885 Mr & Mrs Greene made us a Short call this afternoon

Made roos[t] for the chickens in the west chicken houses

George went to Davisville this afternoon

North wind quite Strong

Sat 7 Feb 1885

1885 Made corrells for the two old Sows in the lot near the Barn and one for the calvs in the orchard

Sun 8 Feb 1885 1885 Mrs Pierce and Self attended church at Davisville North wind and quite cold

Mon 9 Feb 1885 1885 Run three plows on the Somerfallow

North wind moderate

Mr & Mrs Miller called to day

Tues 10 Feb 1885 1885 North wind moderate

Run three plows. the land is two (sic) wet in places

Wed 11 Feb 1885 1885 Plowed the gardin the Second time.

Rev Mr Anderson made us a Short call to day

North wind quite Strong

Thurs 12 Feb 1885 1885 Strong north wind all day and quite cold.

Somehting is the matter with the pigs I have lost 4 lately I gave them sulfur to night

Fri 13 Feb 1885 [No entry]

Sat 14 Feb 1885

1885 Mr Dopkin Ann and George come to day to make us a visit

Sun 15 Feb 1885 1885 Mr Dopkins Ann And George went home to day

Ann is 56 years old to day

Mon 16 Feb - Fri 20 Feb 1885 [No entries]

Sat 21 Feb 1885 1885 Planted Potatoes Corn & Beets in the gardin

Mr Kiethly got pig paid \$15.00

[Note: There are no more entries for 1885 in the 1884 diary volume. The new diary for 1885, a smaller volume has no entries until Monday April 6th. This records for 22 February through 5 April 1885 are missing.]

Fifty years ago to day I left Homer State of N. Y. for Wisconsin arived in Ch[ic]ago 17 of May Went through Michigan a foot.

Cold North wind all day

Went to Davisville

Sent two Sacks of wool to the Graingers

Tues 21 Apr 1885

Cold North wind all day. Mr Hopkin[?] was hear to See the yo[u]ng Bulls

Wed 22 Apr 1885

North wind quite Strong. It turned to the South in the afternoon

Mrs Pierce and Self went to Mr Millers this afternoon

Thurs 23 Apr 1885

Strong north wind

Fri 24 Apr 1885

Attended church festivell at Davisville this evening

Put the Hogs in the back field this afternoon

North wind

Sat 25 Apr 1885 Strong North wind most of the day

Repaired the wind mill on the back field

Sun 26 Apr 1885 Clowdy most of the forenoon and loock[s] verry much like rain

Mon 27 Apr 1885 Commenced cutting hay. Went to Davisville and got bones

George marked 94 Lames

Tues 28 Apr 1885 Light Sprincle this forenoon

George went to Davisville with the mairs. Mended Sacks

Finished cutting hay this forenoon for the Second time

George went to Woodland to attend Picnic. The coock went to Davisville

Cut run[n]ers off the grape vines.

Finished raking and bunching hay

Went to Davisville

Tues 12 May 1885 Mrs Pierce and Self went to San Francisco

I attended the Grand Lodge

Mrs Pierce and Self come home today from San Francisco

Wed 27 May 1885 Strong north wind and verry hot most of the day. South wind this evening

Went to Sacramento after help for Mrs Pierce

The coock left this morning

Fri 29 May 1885 Cut Barly in the middle field

Went to Davisville after the coock but She did not come

Sun 31 May 1885 Mrs Pierce and Self attended church at Davisville

Strong South wind all day

Went to Davisville Sold Mr Rud a Bull for \$40.00

Strong South windall day and quite cold. Went to Caheville to mill

Wed 3 June 1885

Strong South west wind and loocks verry much like rain

Mrs Pierce and Self went to Woodland to mill.

Got rope &c for thw Derric

Cut Stack bottom s in the wheat this forenoon

South wind as usual

Fri 5 June 1885

Strong South wind and loocked verry much like rain

Repaired the Brig [Bridge] this side of the Knowl

George and most of the men went to Davisville this afternoon

Sat 6 June 1885

Strong North wind started about 8 Oclock this morning and lasted most of the day

Cut wheat all day

Made Steps at the front gate to get in and out of veicals [vehicles]

Sun 7 June 1885

North wind quite Strong most of the day

Mon 8 June 1885

South wind and quite cool. the men ate dinner at the lower Barn

Went to Davisville this afternoon got load of bones

Tues 9 June 1885
Strong South west wind and loocks verry much like rain

Mr Hampton and Rossa Kelly made us a visit this afternoon

Wed 10 June 1885

Quite a rain last night. the wheat has been to[o] damp to work to day. quite a Shower about two Oclock this afternoon Fenced the Barly and got the gons into the Stuble

Thurs 11 June 1885 Strong South wind and loocks like rain this evening

Fri 12 June 1885 Cold South wind

Mr Hampton and Mrs Cole of San Francisco Stayed hear last night. Mrs Cole went home to day. Mrs Pierce and Self went as far as Davisville with her

Found a Sick Mule when I got home

Sat 13 June 1885 Cool South wind for the Season

Sun 14 June 1885 Cool South wind

Mrs Pierce went to Davisville

Mon 15 June 1885

Cool South wind yet and the coolest harvist So far that I have ever Seen in the State

Went to Davisville

Miss Kelly and Miss Cole come this afternoon. Miss Cole with Stay a fiew days

Wed 17 June 1885 North wind this forenoon and q[u]ite warm

South South (sic) and cool this afternoon [and?] this evening

Thurs 18 June 1885 Miss Cole went to Davisville to day

Rossa Kelly made us a visit to day

Cool South wind to day

Fri 19 June 1885 Cool South wind to day

Miss Cole and Willie Hampton made us a call to day

Earigated Some fruit trees

Mrs Pierce went to Sanfrancisco to See Lilly French She is verry Sick

Miss Cole went home to day

Went to Davisville this afternoon and got load of bones.

Run tire off of one of the Wagons halling wheat
