This transcription from the original letter contains language contemporaneous of the time and is being presented as part of a historical record.

Paradise, Cal Aug 3rd '21

Dear Brother George

I got a card from Bertha Kimball saying Aunt Joanna passed away the 4th of July. I also got a card from the Probate Court in Alfred notifying me that the will would be read at the Probate Court Room on Aug 9th. I would like to be there, as there are relatives who will be there that will probably never meet together again, I hope you will go and if you do I wish you would write me and tell me about it and who was there. I got a letter from Aunt Joanna about a year ago and she told me she had just made her will, and she mentioned several things she wanted me to have, and I wrote her a nice letter thanking her and telling her I hope she would live to enjoy life for some time to come. She also said she had willed you and I \$500.00 each. I think she realized at that time that her time was drawing nigh. We are all well and working hard It has been a very warm summer here. I have worked over a year on the county highway as powder man using giant powder blowing out trees and rocks for new roads I have no news to write so will close. We all send best for you all,
