Paradise, Cal., Feb 8- '29

My Dear Brother

I am just writing you a line to let you know how Marie is getting along.

She is just about the same as when you left but a little weaker. She cant sleep but a very little Mrs. Lucius is staying with her day times, I am with her nights. I get off every afternoon and sleep about 3 hours and I get a little at night. Last night I went to bed at 9 o'clock and slept till 11.30, and went to bed again at 1 o'clock and slept till 2.30.

I don't see how she can last much longer unless something unforeseen happens.

We are all well otherwise and miss you all very much. I got Olives card saying you were going to leave Los Angeles Wednesday. Hope you had a good trip home. I sent you 3 Paradise papers yesterday very cold here now. It cleared up Wednesday and we had the coldest night in 20 years. It was 20° above, a little warmer this morning.

Currier beat [Gardick?]. 65 to 47. Best love to all
