Dear Brother George —

I am sending you by express to day, 3 boxes of figs, all mailed together.

One box is for you, one for Clem & one for Frank. We have had a bunch of rain here the past week.

It started in Sunday the 8th and has not cleared up yet it is still cloudy.

In 8 days we got over 18 inches, the most I ever saw here in one storm. The Dam will be running over by tomorrow. Alley was up there yesterday and he said he could see it raise. Every one feels better here as it was awful dry.

We are all well. Would like to be with you Christmas. This is not a letter. I think you owe me one. Wishing you all a Merry Christmas. Paul is out with his last load of apples.
