This transcription from the original letter contains language contemporaneous of the time and is being presented as part of a historical record.

Creston May 5th 1915

My Dear Boy

I send you today the Sunday Edition of the San Francisco Chronicle it will give you an idea of the style of newspaper published in California & also of the doings at the exposition Got a letter from Winfield a few days ago he says the prospects for a fruit crop were never better He has taken the fruit ranch adjoining his & if he can find a market will make some money. They were all well when he wrote. Isn't the war in Europe a terrible affair they are all acting more like savages than humans & if we don't get roped into it we will be lucky. We have had fine rains the past weeks & big crops are assured When did you hear [fr?] Sister Joana & who has she with her now Write me all the news
