My Dear Brother

I write you just a line to tell you I have found our father. I got a nice letter from him to day, and he wishes to come and see me. He is living at Creston, San Luis Obispo Co, Cal. He writes me he is living all alone at a Hotel and is very lonely. I have written him to come, and come soon as possible. Don't write to him till you hear from me again, as he might be with me, and would miss getting your letter. I will write you immediately after he gets here. No news to write. "We all's send our best love to you alls."
